
Kids and families are invited to attend this come-and-go after school program. All LEGO bricks and supplies will be provided.

Passenger, by Alexandra Bracken. 2016. "In one devastating night, violin prodigy Etta Spencer loses everything she knows and loves. Thrust into an unfamiliar world by a stranger with a dangerous agenda, Etta is certain of only one thing: she has traveled not just miles, but years from home.




Olympians: Poseidon Earth Shaker, by George O'Connor. 2013. Graphic novel. Graphically adapts the adventures of the Greek god of the seas, presenting the myth of how Poseidon became the king of the oceans and such stories as Theseus and the Minotaur, Odysseus and Polyphemos, and the founding of Athens.

Challenger Deep, by Neal Shusterman. 2015. National Book Award Winner. Caden Bosch is on a galleon that's headed for the deepest point on Earth: Challenger Deep, the southern part of the Marianas Trench. Bosch, a gifted high school student, is split between his allegiance to the captain and the allure of mutiny. Caden Bosch is torn. Caden Bosch is dealing with schizophrenia... and as fantasy and paranoia begin to take over, his parents have only one choice left.



Of Poseiden, by Anna Banks. 2012. (Book 1 of the Syrena Legacy series). Galen, prince of the Syrena, is sent to land to find a girl he's heard can communicate with fish. He finds Emma and after several encounters, including a deadly one with a shark, Galen becomes convinced Emma holds the key to his kingdom.



Dept. H. (series), by Matt **Kindt. 2017.** Graphic novels. Mia is a special investigator

hired to uncover possible sabotage taking place at a deep-sea research station. What she uncovers is a mind-blowing crime scene filled with suspects with terrible secrets, strange deep-sea creatures, and an impending flood! Also, check out the sequels, Pressure and Decompressed.

The Lifeboat Clique, by Kathy Parks. 2016. During a party a tsunami hits the coast of California, and Denver and a handful of others escape death and are swept out to sea. Of course, one of her fellow castaways is none other than her ex-BFF, Abigail, who can barely stand the sight of her. Trapped on a small boat with the most popular kids in school and waiting to be rescued, Denver wonders what might kill her first--dehydration, sunstroke, or the girl she used to think of as a sister? ◆

Whale and Clown Fish Paper Cup Craft



SUPPLIES

- Paper dessert cup
- Small styrofoam ball
- Tissue paper
- Pipe cleaner
- Toothpick
- Wiggle eyes
- Paper
- Paint

EQUIPMENT

- Scissors
- Glue

DIRECTIONS



1. First I cut a portion of the dessert cup about a quarter from the side so that it sits flat on a surface.

2. Cut out a tail, fins and a tongue for your whale, make sure to leave room for a tab on the tail. Glue your pieces to your whale. Add a wiggle eyes too.

3. Paper mache your little styrofoam ball with the tissue paper. Mix glue and water in a small cup, brush it over your styrofoam ball and apply the tissue paper. Brush a little more glue on top. Let it dry well.



4. Cut out fins and a tail for your fish from cardstock paper. I painted some details on them with acrylic paint.

5. I sandwiched a toothpick between two paper cutouts for the tail and pressed it into the styrofoam ball but you can skip this step if you'd like.

6. Paint stripes on your fish and glue on all of the fins. Paint on a face or use wiggle eyes.

The Mouse Watch: Underwater, by J. J. Gilbert. 2021. Six months after being recruited to the Mouse Watch, brave mouse Bernie and shy rat Jarvis are now officially Level One agents and are getting along like cheese and crackers! Bernie and Jarvis suit up--in scuba suits, this time--for a deep-sea mission on a submarine the size of a shark snack. As they come whisker-to-whisker with hungry sea creatures, a mercenary mouse pirate, the underwater city of Catlantis, and nefarious nemeses at every turn, the pair will have to use every ounce of their bravery and ingenuity to find the Milk Saucer first--and save the world.



Deep Water, by Watt Key. 2019. When a dive off the coast of Alabama goes horribly wrong, twelve-year-old Julie and one of her father's scuba clients struggle to survive after reaching an abandoned oil rig.



Stink and the Shark Sleepover, by Megan McDonald. 2014. (#9 in series). When Stink's parents win tickets for the whole family to sleep over at the aquarium (along with Stink's two best friends), it sounds like a science freak's dream come true. Stink loves the sea-creature scavenger hunt (Bat ray! Brain coral!), the jellyfish light show, and the shiver of sand tiger sharks with razor-sharp teeth. Stink is nuts about gross stuff, but after some spooky stories around the virtual campfire, can he fall asleep thinking about the eating habits of the vampire squid?


Splash Dance, by Davy Ocean. 2015. (#6 in series). Everyone in Shark Point is talking about the end-of-theyear school party. There's a dance contest with a supercool Fintendo DS game system up for grabs! Harry the Hammerhead's got his eye on the prize, but he needs someone to help him with his moves...especially when number one enemy Rick Reef enters the contest. Can Harry get into his groove and beat the competition?

A Crack in the Sea, by H. M. Bouwman. 2017. No one comes to the Second World



on purpose. The doorway between worlds opens only when least expected. The Raft King is desperate to change that by finding the doorway that will finally take him and the people of Raftworld back

Here Comes Ocean, by Meg Fleming. 2020. Grab a big bucket, your best pup pal, and a whole lot of imagination, and get ready for a day at the beach! There's endless fun to be had chasing the waves and countless treasures waiting to be discovered--first a sand dollar, then a sandpiper feather, even a sneaky little crab. What surprises will the ocean reveal next? This sandy, salty, seekand-find picture book is perfect for families who love the water, kids who love collecting, and ocean enthusiasts of all ages.


The Aquanaut, by Jill Heinerth. 2021. What if your bedroom were a space station? What would it be like to have flippers or tusks? In your own home you can explore new worlds and meet new friends. Jaime Kim's illustrations transport readers back and forth through time to see how Jill's imagination as a young girl laid the pathway to her accomplishments and experiences as an underwater explorer.

Lottie & Walter, by Anna Walker. 2019. Lottie goes to swim lessons every Saturday, but she never gets in the water. That's because she is convinced there is a shark in the pool, a shark that wants to eat her and only her. But then Walter appears. Walter likes singing and reading books and bubble baths, and his favorite food is fish sticks, just like Lottie. When Saturday rolls around again, Lottie is no more ready to jump in the pool than she was before. Or is she? Sometimes it just takes a special friend to find the courage that was inside you all along. \blacklozenge




Wendell the Narwhal, by Emily Dove. 2016. Wendall sets off to look for friends, but no one can see past his big pointy nose. The octopus

Hello, Sea Friends!, by Sam Garton. 2016. Otter--the irrepressible picture book character sure to be adored by fans of Llama Llama--takes a trip to visit sea friends and meet all the animals that live in the ocean.



Pete at the Beach, by James Dean. 2013. Pete is spending the day at the seashore. He has fun collecting shells and building a sand castle. But the beach is very hot. There is a whole ocean for Pete to cool off in, but it looks scary. Pete's brother, Bob, offers to teach Pete to surf. Will that be enough to help Pete get over his fear of the water?

There Was an Old Mermaid Who Swallowed a Shark, by Lucille Colandro. 2018. In this adaptation of the traditional nursery rhyme, a mermaid swims through the ocean swallowing various marine animals, starting with a shark, while two children ask questions and comment on the different creatures.



Sabrina Sue Loves the Sea, by Priscilla Burris. 2021. Little chicken Sabrina Sue lives on a farm but dreams of the sea, and despite the other farm animals telling her she is ridiculous and silly, she decides to set out on an adventure to finally see the ocean.



Just an Adventure at Sea, by Mercer Mayer. 2017. Little Critter and his dad take their boat to sea to go whale watching and find that the ocean is a great place for adventure. Stinky Spike the Pirate Dog, by Paul Meisel. 2108. Ahoy! When a shipyard pup gets lost at sea, he's rescued by a crew of stinky pirates led by Captain Fishbeard. Spike must prove to the captain he can be a real pirate. Luckily, Stinky Spike has the best nose on the seven seas, and he uses it to sniff out all kinds of treasure.



Sea Sheep, by Eric Seltzer. 2020. Illustrations and easyto-read, rhyming text introduce the reader to humorous sheep that can swim, dive, play pirates, read books, and much more.



Ocean Life Up Close (series). Various authors. Non-fiction for beginning readers with many different ocean-related creatures to learn about, from orcas and seals to corals and sharks. ◆

Overboard!, by Terry Lynn Johnson. 2017. Eleven-year-old Travis and his family are on a whale watch off the coast of Washington when disaster strikes. The boat capsizes, throwing everyone into the icecold chaotic waves. Separated from their families and struggling to stay afloat, Travis and twelveyear-old Marina must use all of their grit and knowledge to survive.
